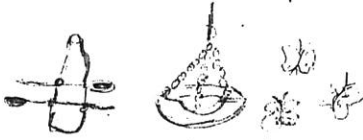


BIODIVERSITY

We made bird feeders from recycle plastic bottles and wooden spoons.



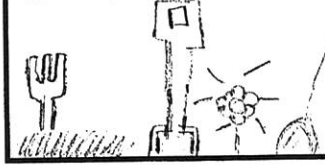
To attract butterflies and insects to our wildlife garden we made butterfly feeders- from plastic food trays, string and beads.
