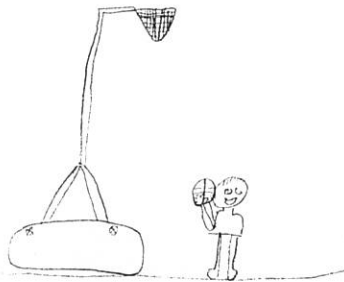


The Health Committee looks after the playground toys, pumps up the balls and cleans the toy box. If there are any broken toys we put them in the bin and get new toys.
