


Primary 2

Please aim to complete 3 activities - try to pick one from each curricular area.

Literacy	How to build a snowman Draw/Write a set of instructions for building a snowman. Use words First, Next, Then, After that and Finally to order them.	Read a book to a family member. What is your favourite character in the book? Draw a picture of it and write about why you like them.	Write these words in your best handwriting and then write them replacing the vowels with a snowflake. cold, wet, sunny, frozen, igloo, frost, snowman	
Numeracy	Finding $\frac{1}{2}$ of a number Get some pasta shapes and then use them to find half of these numbers - 6,12,16,18, 10, 8, 14	Ask an adult for a set of weighing scales. Choose 6 different things to weigh. Which is the lightest? Which is the heaviest?	Go for a walk around your house and find out how many clocks or digital displays you can find. Write down the total number you find.	
Health and wellbeing	Go for a snowy day walk with your family or play in the garden. Take a photo of your favourite thing you see.	Make a snow animal, cat, dog, penguin, and take a photo of it. What is its name? What does it like to eat?	Draw around your hand and then draw pictures in each finger of the fruit and vegetables you eat today.	
Other	Animal Tracks Look in your garden for animal tracks in the snow. Can you identify which animal made them?	Look out in your garden, how many different birds can you see? Can you find out what they are called?	Help someone in your family with a household chore, dusting, washing dishes, tidying up toys.
