Please aim to complete three activities- try to pick a variety of curricular areas.

Literacy	Create a news report about the snowy weather including details about how it is affecting your area and your family.	Write a winter poem using rhyming language.	Write an imaginative story about getting stuck in a snow storm. Remember to use lots of descriptive language and to write in paragraphs.	Enjoy reading a book by your favourite author. Write a book review to encourage someone else to read it.
Numeracy	Choose three dates that are significant to you (e.g. birthday, holiday, a competition). Use a calendar to calculate and then record how many days, weeks or months there are until each event.	Create a detailed scale map of your bedroom or living room. When making your map think about the scale you should use, any symbols, colours or patterns to show different objects.	Look for examples of tessellations at home, outside or in the media. Try sketching any examples you find. Bring them back to class and share your findings.	Practise your times tables using a variety of games and activities.
Health and Wellbeing	Create some of your own PE cool down ideas	Create some fun fruit recipes. You can make and illustrate recipe cards, giving step by step instructions. Think about how to make the recipes healthier by using less sugar and more fruit.	With the help of an adult, find and follow a recipe to make a hearty Winter Warmer soup.	Take interesting photographs of anything snowy to share with the class.
Other	Using the internet, find out what parts of the world are cold all year round. Note down your findings.	Make a French "colours" word search for a friend to try in school.	Research a famous artist of your choice. Find out facts about this artist, the period in which they were famous, the style of art and examples of the pieces they have created.
