
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Literacy	Draw a picture of you out playing in the snow. Get an adult to write the story for you.	Read a book with an older child or adult. Tell them about your favourite part of the story.	Think of words to describe a snowy day and get an adult to help you write them in a list.	
Numeracy	Draw around an adult's hand. How many pieces of pasta can you fit on it? Count them and glue them on.	Get 10 pieces of pasta and find out how many adding or takeaway sums you can make. Write them down.	Go for a walk around your house and find out how many clocks or digital displays you can find. Write down the total number.	
Health and wellbeing	Go for a snowy day walk with your family or play in the garden. Take a photo of your favourite thing you see.	Make a snow animal, cat, dog, penguin, and take a photo of it. What is its name? What does it like to eat?	Draw around your hand and then draw pictures in each finger of the fruit and vegetables you eat today.	
Other	Draw or paint a snowy day picture. Add lots of detail.	Look out in your garden, how many different birds can you see? Can you find out what they are called?	Help someone in your family with a household chore, dusting, washing dishes, tidying up toys.
