Please aim to complete three activities- try to pick a variety of curricular areas.

Literacy	Write a story about something or someone getting stuck in the snow and describe how they are rescued. Add interesting details and remember to write in paragraphs.	Read a book to a family member. What is your favourite character in the book? Draw a picture of it and write about why you like them.	Write a list of adjectives to describe a snowy day (at least 8) Then write them in your best joined handwriting and then in alphabetical order.	
Numeracy	Take Away Challenge Using a menu card or online menu, ask each member of your family to choose a main course. Find the total amount to pay and how much change you would get from £50	Ask an adult for a set of weighing scales. Choose 6 different things to weigh. Record the weight of each object in grams. Which is the heaviest? Which is the lightest? What is the difference in the 2 weights?	Snowball Challenge How many snow balls (tennis ball size) can you make in 2 mins? Play the game with other members of the family. Who was the winner and how many snowballs were made individually and in total?	
Health and Wellbeing	Go for a snowy day walk with your family or play in the garden. Take a photo of your favourite thing you see.	Make a snow animal, cat, dog, penguin and take a photo of it. What is its name? What does it like to eat?	Draw around your hand and then draw pictures in each finger of the fruit and vegetables you eat today.	
Other	Can you find out why we put salt on icy or snowy roads? What affect does it have and how long have we done this in the U.K.?	Research using the internet or books to find out which animals change colour in winter and find out the reasons why.	Help someone in your family with a household chore, dusting, washing dishes, tidying up toys.
